



## Professor Patricia Price MA MD FRCR FRCP

### CONSULTANT CLINICAL ONCOLOGIST

Professor Pat Price has been working to redefine cancer treatment for 35 years. She trained in general medicine in Cambridge and in oncology at the Royal Marsden Hospital. She undertook her research degree at the Institute of Cancer Research and was awarded the Cambridge University medal for best laboratory-based MD in 1991.

Pat worked as a clinical academic oncologist at Hammersmith Hospital with research programme grants from the UK Medical Research Council, Cancer Research UK and the US National Institute of Health. In 2000, she established the first Ralston Paterson Chair in Radiation Oncology at the Christie Hospital and set up the new Wolfson Molecular Imaging Centre at the University of Manchester.

Pat has had a long-standing professional relationship with Imperial College, and in 2010 returned as a Visiting Professor in Oncology Home - Professor Patricia Price ([imperial.ac.uk](http://imperial.ac.uk)). She is now involved in a large-scale international research programme to develop new quantitative in vivo imaging technology, and a unique investigation aimed at developing laser-based productions of high energy ions for new therapy in cancer. She has an international reputation in the molecular imaging of tumour biology and is currently a director of a molecular imaging advisory company. In addition to her research, Pat chairs the Radiation Oncology Executive Board for HCA Healthcare UK. She also co-edits the UK standard textbook of oncology "Treatment of Cancer", now in its 7th edition with more than 380 research publications. She shares her passion in the field with her husband, a leading academic medical physicist, and her academic partner on some research endeavours. She has two sons and three stepchildren and is based in London and Wilmslow.





Pat founded and is Chair of Trustees of the national charity Radiotherapy UK, which is appointed as the secretariat for the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Radiotherapy (APPG-RT) aiming to improve radiotherapy in the UK. She created the high profile #CatchUpWithCancer campaign during the Covid pandemic to lobby the Government for a new national cancer recovery plan. She has also taken her work international, co-founding the Global Coalition for Radiotherapy, a network of colleagues in cancer treatment aimed at providing equitable access to

radiotherapy for cancer patients around the world. Most recently they established a radiotherapy task force to support cancer therapy in Ukraine during the current conflict.
